## AYURVEDIC MANAGEMENT OF MUKHA DUSHIKA

### ABSTRACT

*Mukha dushika* or *Youvana Pidaka* mentioned under *Kshudra Roga* can be can be correlated to acne vulgaris in contemporary science. *Mukha dushika* defines as that which disfigures the face along with discoloration. As it is one of the major cosmetic problems which youth are facing, an attempt is made to cover all the treatment modalities mentioned in classics. References from various classical text books like Ashtanga Hrudayam, Ashtanga Sangraha, Susruta samhita, Basvarajeeyam, Chakradatta, Bhavaprakasha, Yogaratnakara, Gadanigraha etc., are thoroughly reviewed and incorporated in this article. As *Rasoushadhis* are fast acting with very minimal dose, considering these various books like Rasatarangini, Rasamritam, *Rasendra Sara Sangrahakara were* also referred. *Vamana, Siravyadha, Nasya, Abhyanjana* are the *Shodhana* line of management. *Lepas* are the most common treatment modalities mentioned all classical text books. *Rasaoushadhis* also plays an important role in the management of *Mukha dushika*, Drugs like *Manasila, Gorochana, Shilajatu, Sudha Parpati, Shankha Bhasma* were noticed in the management of *Mukha dushika*. Apart from classical references some list of patent medicines is also helpful.

### INTRODUCTION

Face is the index of mind and beauty. Cosmetic health condition that worries youth is acne, which causes both physical and psychological scar having negative impact on social lives and self-esteem. Acne in Ayurveda is termed as *Mukha dushika*, it defined as the painful eruptions resembles similar to the thorns of Shalmali filled with *Meda*, having their site on the face of adults are known as *Mukha dushika*.<sup>[1]</sup> As it is more prominent in *Yuvavasta* it is also known as *Yauvana Pidaka* or *Tarunya pidaka*. All these features resemble with that of Acne Vulgaris. Acne is a disorder of the pilosebaceous units which predominantly affects the pre- pubertal population and clinically manifest as comedones, papules, pustules, nodules, cyst and heals with scars.

*Mukha dushika* is classified under *Kshudra Roga*. The term *Kshudra* means small, minor, or negligible. *Roga* means disease. *Kshudra Rogas* are the diseases of minor origin with less importance.

Hence, all those diseases which manifest with few causative factors, with a minimal signs and symptoms and which subsides with little medicines and treatments can be called as *Kshudra roga*.<sup>[1]</sup> Therefore, the exact description of *Nidana Panchakas (Nidana, Purvaroopa, Rupa, Upashaya, Samprapti*) are not available in classics. Hence, the management of *Mukha dushika* is done mainly with *Kupita doshas. Ashtanga Sangrahakara* and *Ashtanga Hrudayakara* mentioned *Kapha* and *Vata* as the major *Doshas* involved. In other classics like *Yoga Ratnakara, Bhava Prakasha, Madava Nidana* etc involvement of *Kapha, Vata,* and *Rakta* is mentioned.

Various classics like Susruta Samhita,<sup>[2]</sup> Ashtanga Sangraha,<sup>[3]</sup> Ashtanga Hrudavam,<sup>[4]</sup> Chakradatta,<sup>[5]</sup> Bhavaprakasha,<sup>[6]</sup> Yogaratnakara,<sup>[7]</sup> Samhita,<sup>[9]</sup> Gada Nigraha,<sup>[8]</sup> Vangasena Basava Rajeeyam,<sup>[10]</sup> Bhaishajya Ratnavali <sup>[11]</sup> etc are consulted for the management and formulations used in Mukha dushika. For proprietary Ayurvedic preparations Ayurvedline<sup>[12]</sup> indexing text is also consulted. *Rasoushadis* and are also incorporated in this article.

## Management of *Mukha Dushika* as per Classical Ayurvedic Texts

## Susruta Samhita

- 1. Vamana
- 2. Lepa prepared from Vacha, Lodhra, Saindava, Sarshapa, Danyaka.
- 3. Lepa with Vacha, Lodra, Kushta and Danyaka.

## Ashtanga Sangraha

- 1. Warm paste of Lodhra and Tuvarika
- 2. Tender leaves of Vata and Narikela Shukti
- 3. Saindava, Vaca, Akshibeshaja and Siddhartaka
- 4. Vamana
- 5. Sira Vyadha on forehead

## Ashtanga Hrudayam

- 1. Paste of *Rodhra* (*Lodhra*), *Kustumburu* (*Dhanyaka*) and *Vacha*
- 2. Tender leaves of Vata and Narikela shukti- Lepa
- 3. Vamana
- 4. Nasya
- 5. Sira vyadha on forehead
- 6. *Lepa* prepared with the combination of *Yava pishti*, *Sarjarasa*, *Lodhra*, *Usheera*, *Raktachandana*, *Madhu*, *Ghrita*, and *Guda*. Which are taken in equal quantity in a vessel and 4 parts of *Gomutra* is to be added and *Paka* is done, until it attains semisolid state. Later has to be taken out from the *Agni* and cooled.

## DISCUSSION

Classical references show that various measures like shows *Shamana* and *Shodhana* line of managements. *Gritas, Tailas, Lepas* etc. are mentioned for *Shamana* line of management. Treatment modalities like *Nasya, Vamana, Siravyadha* etc are mentioned for *Shodhana* line of management.

Acharya Vagbhata has mentioned that first *Lepa yogas* have to be tried, if it does not get subsided, one has to go for *Shodhana* like *Vamana, Nasya.* If then also it does not get subsided, then one has to go for *Siravyadha* from *Lalatta* region (forehead). *Shodhana* procedures like *Vamana, Nasya, Siravyadha* has its own significance. All *Jatrurdwa Vikaras* can be better treated with *Vamana, Nasya, Siravyadha* etc procedure. As *Mukha dushika* is *Kapha Pradana Vyadi* and *Jatrurdwa Vikaras* we can opt these methods for better result.<sup>[29]</sup>

In Bhava Prakasha the thickness of Lepa is clearly mentioned. For Samanya, Madyama and Uttama *Matra* the thickness of *Lepa* should be  $\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\frac{1}{3}$ , and  $\frac{1}{2}$ Angula Pramana. Lepa should be removed once it starts drying. The drugs used for Lepa can also be utilised for Vamana. [30] The Lepa with drugs like Dhanyaka, Lodhra, Vacha has been mentioned in almost all classical books. Therefore, this voga can be considered as the first drug of choice for Mukha dushika. Almost all drugs which are mentioned for treatment of Mukha dushika are having similar properties like Tikta, Kashaya Rasa, which can balance Kapha and Pitta Doshas. These drugs also have Kandugna, Kushtagna, Twachya properties too which proves that these formulations better yield in the treatment of Mukha dushika. In literature it is not mentioned regarding the vitiation of Pitta Dosha aggravates the disease instead it is mentioned that Rakta vitiation along with Kapha and Vata causes Mukha dushika. The Ashraya Ashrayi Sambhanda of Rakta and Pitta give further clarity here.

Few Rasoushadhis like Shankha Bhasma, Sudha Parpati, Manasila, Shilajatu, Rasasindhura are also mentioned in classics. These medicines are also having Kandugna, Kushtagna, Twachya properties. As these are Rasoushadis, with proper purificatory process it can be better utilised for the management of *Mukha dushika*.

In many of the patent medicines it is noticed that Shankha Bhasma is one of the most common ingredients. The rationality behind selection of Shankha Bhasma maybe it is clearly mentioned in the Phala Sruthi.<sup>[31]</sup> Also, Shankha is the only marine source which is rich in calcium. The role of calcium in the skin health is very much necessary. Research has shown that the endoplasmic reticulum (ER), an intracellular Ca2+ store, is crucial in forming the epidermal calcium gradient. The ER's calcium homeostasis regulates keratinocyte differentiation, Intercellular junction formation, antimicrobial barrier function, permeability barrier homeostasis. In essence, the ER's calcium regulation is essential for maintaining healthy skin functions and preventing skin disorders. [32]

Its treatment modalities are very well explained in classical books. The proper *Yukthi* of *Vaidhya* makes better selection of drugs and to treat *Mukha dushika*. Hence, these enlisted formulations better ease a physician in drug selection. By proper care and hygiene, we can cure *Mukha dushika* without any adverse effect.

## CONCLUSION

*Mukha dushika* is the disease which harms the beauty of the skin. The site and period of occurrence of the disease is face and adolescent age. *Mukha dushika* may be a *Kshudra roga* (minor skin ailment) but a big problem in beauty conscious adolescent population. Though there is no much detailed description of *Mukha dushika* in classics. *Lepa* has its significance in the treatment of *Kshudra rogas*. It was observed that different *Lepas* along with internal medicine and *Shodhana karma* are effective in the management of *Mukha dushika*.
